EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

John's Good News

John's gospel is the fourth and last of the four to be written. A number of scholars think that the whole community at John's church in Ephesus had a hand in putting this gospel together, and that John himself was the authority behind the composition. It's important for us to realize that each one of us is a product of many educators, and our parents for most of us were the authority behind the finished product.

The first part of this gospel from Chapter 2 to Chapter 12 is known as the Book of Signs. John does not use the word miracle, but the first sign, albeit a premature one of who Jesus really is, is changing the water into wine at the Wedding in Cana. Remember, Jesus often identified himself by what he did; the blind see, the lame walk, the deaf hear, etc. Do we still consider that what a person does tells us who he or she is? The greatest sign of who Jesus was shows up as the seventh sign on the seventh day in the Gospel – a new week of a new creation – the raising of Lazarus from the dead. You or I would probably be a little skeptical; "Are you sure he was really dead?"

John also uses a number of favorite themes in his gospel such as life, love, light, Son of God, Word of God, Spirit, Truth, Lamb of God, King of the Jews, Good Shepherd, and Prophet. Do we have favorite words when we think of Jesus? Notice that none of John's chosen themes have a negative connotation.

Today we also had a reading from the second book of Chronicles which Jewish people regarded as the conclusion of the Old Testament. Both books of Chronicles tell the story of David and Solomon, including all the good stuff and omitting the negative. These books were written after the Exile, and for many modern Jewish people, the monarchy was the golden period of Jewish history. If you or I were asked to say what was the golden period of our past, what would we say? What was the context of that time?

If we model our lives after John's gospel, we will be very tolerant, inclusive of everybody, very positive about the future, and very much aware of making sure the signs say what is good news for all of us! What we do may in
